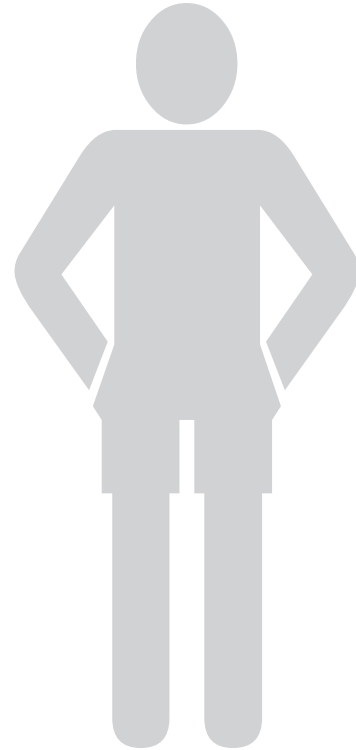

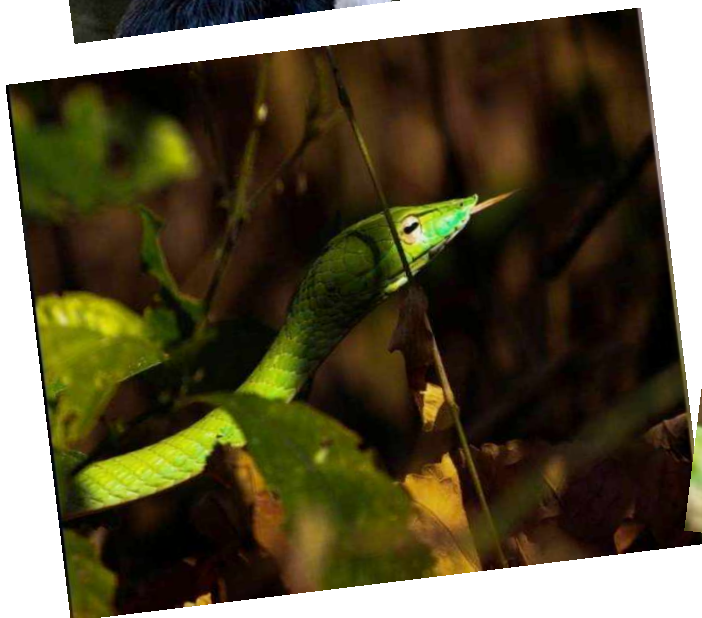
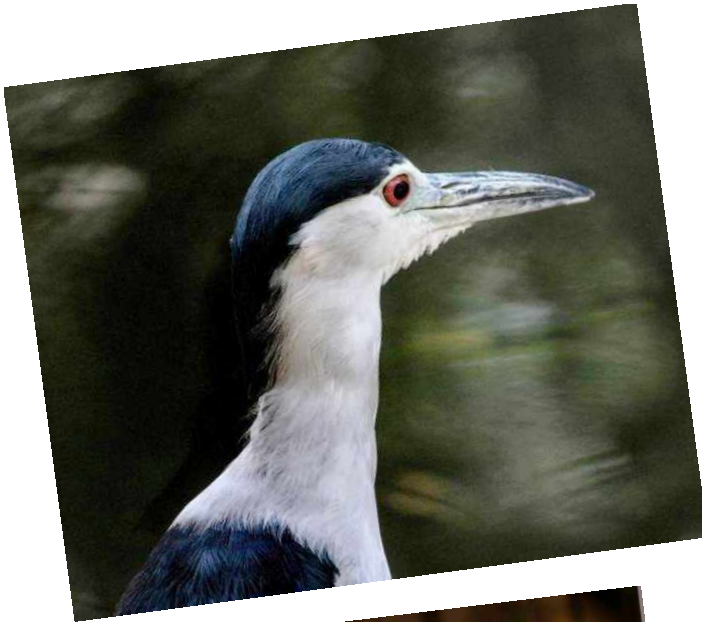

# Helping Hearts

Our team Helping Hearts emerged in the year 2009 by cluster of passionate college students and now it has stepped into its 11th successful year. Energetic engineering pupils in full swing got together to work for the cause of society. It's a story of how the techies have transcended boundaries to help the poor and the needy. Life was much more than academics for us. We gradually roped in like-minded students of many colleges and actively supported for the welfare of our society. Thus there born a Helping Hearts Organization. Our team's greatest strength is the consistent support and untiring efforts of the youth. Our entire team comprises of students from different colleges and youngsters working in various corporate concerns.

Registered our organization on 22nd April 2009 & stepped into service from 1st May 2009 onwards.

We are currently focusing on projects related to social welfare, community development and environmental protection.

### **Community development:**

*Pre-Owned Garments* - This initiative is specially for reducing cloth waste and at the same time empathizing needy community by setting up garments camp at different areas encouraging needy people to shop the dresses which they like. Good condition used dresses are collected through stalls, quality check is carried out on the collected dresses and the same is sent to laundry for washing and ironing. Once the dresses are in ready condition then they are taken to display. As on date 15+ camps are organised and 1500+ people are benefitted with 5000+ dresses.

*Dairy Farming* - Now a days mostly milk powder is used than fresh milk due to high consumers and low milk production. Most of the farmers are quitting dairy farming as they couldn't sustain the same due to various factors. We all are brought up in a community where milk plays a vital role in our daily



food consumption, the one who could offer can pay high and can avail the best but it's becoming a dream for the needy ones so we got into this dairy farming to support the local community with fresh raw milk. Our Dairy farming is carried out in Pollachi with a supply of average 40 liters raw fresh milk per day to local community people.

**Social welfare:**

*Old Age Home* - This initiative is to care the uncared senior citizens left in roads, hospitals, public places, from relations. Our volunteers/staffs with loads of love and affection take care of the basic needs of granny's. Periodical health check up, regular medications, indoor/outdoor activities, outing, entertainment activities, clothing, food, etc are provided. As on date two old age homes are functioning, one in Coimbatore and another in Pollachi with 55 inmates in total.

*Hospice* - This initiative is to care the uncared elderly patients left in roads, hospitals, public places, from relations. Most of the inmates in Hospice are bedridden and require regular supervision which is provided with loads of love and affection by our staffs. Periodical health check up, regular medications, indoor/outdoor activities, outing, entertainment activities, clothing, food, etc are provided. Our hospice is functioning in Coimbatore with a strength of 20 inmates as on date.

**Environmental protection:**

*Vegetable Garden* - We know there are many reserved sites in city which are used as dump yard by the local community people to dump their garbage. We took one of the reserved site in Coimbatore and cleared the garbage and other wastes and converted the same to a vegetable garden. Our gardener takes care of the garden on daily basis, he sow the seeds, waters it and harvest it in natural organic way. This initiative is to promote natural veggies for a healthy living. The vegetable harvested in this garden are consumed in our old age homes.

*Seedling Nursery* - This initiative is to inculcate organic farming in public and educate people about environment protection and sustainable development. We sow the seeds and grow the seedling to a certain height and provide them to public who are interested to grow the same in their house. Through this initiative we are promoting small scale home gardening/terrace gardening for a healthy living.

## Sigaram Thodu

An awareness program "Sigaram Thodu" for the girl students was conducted by SKCET Alumni Association on 17.10.2019. The sessions include Health and personal Hygiene, Security Issues and Awareness and Overcoming Gender Inequality.

He also beautifully jotted out 10 points

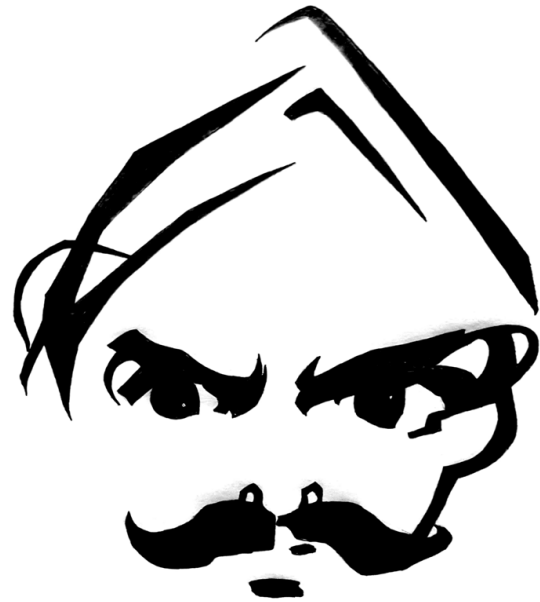
- 1) A positive approach to the peer pressure.

## Functional Safety for FOTA (Flash Over-The-Air)

### Abstract:

Imagine updating our automotive microcontroller units as we do for the applications on our phone. This is becoming a reality with the advent of FOTA. This feature enables the update of the software of an ECU without the driver having to take the trouble to visit the nearest garage, and in some cases, even without his/her knowledge. This is proposed to be achieved through the diagnostic ecosystem that the OEMs have invested heavily upon but requires the standalone control unit in the vehicle to be capable of mimicking the functionality of a Diagnostic tester/PC in the garage with its own diagnostic computing capabilities. The quantum of other possibilities achieved through the same window is huge, to say the least; as the same facility can be used to promote other features like calibration updates over the air, remote diagnostic troubleshooting by the OEM backend, preventive diagnostics and real-time data sharing through IoT cloud which could be the bread and butter to create the environment for Automated driving.

The perspective of this article is the functional safety of any automobile ECU for the mentioned feature. The nature of FOTA allows different connected services which are of different functional safety impacts. For example, the updating of non-safety relevant delta updates can happen even when the vehicle is fully operational. But for the connected service where the implementation is of any safety integrity concern (Eg. update of the whole application software or safety-relevant calibration parameter), it is crucial to detect the safe state of the vehicle lest it may lead to the malfunction of the control unit to violate safety goal. In most cases, the update of the software is done by the bootloader and hence the application-level runtime software is in no position to take charge until the full operation is completed. Incapacitating the application software during runtime can lead to catastrophically dangerous situations. So several parts of the connected services have to be ASIL rated to prevent the violation of safety goal.

To summarize, the detection of a safe state for an ASIL relevant connected service implementation is the concern of functional safety. When the vehicle is not in "safe state", the safety function (monitoring software) will continually decline the safety-critical OTA request by the gateway ECU.

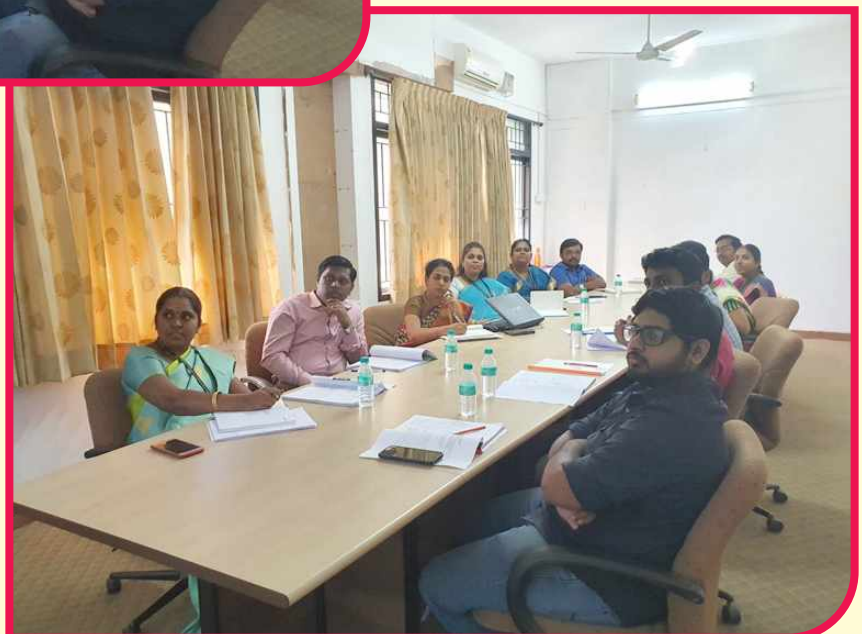

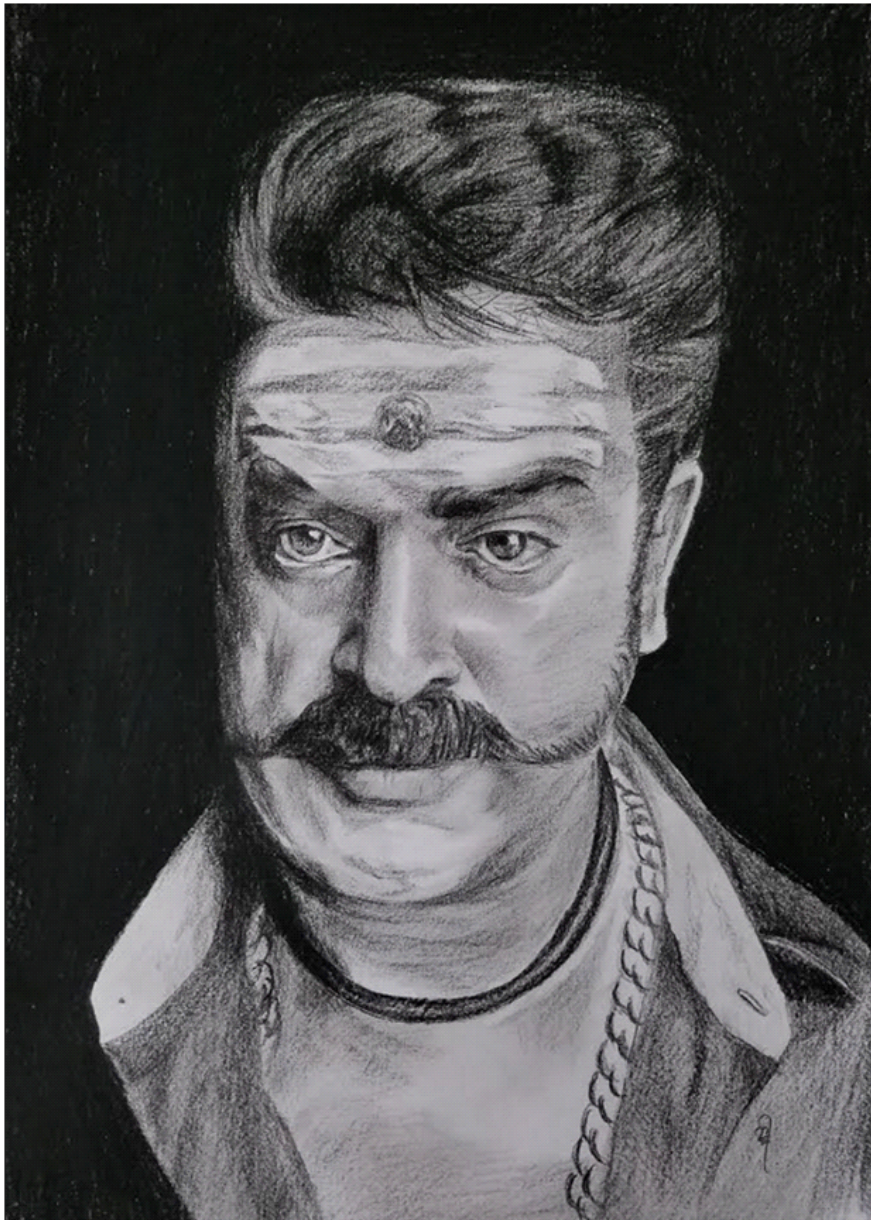
